

Make a Plan



Making a plan for reuniting with family members after a disaster can go a long way to relieve stress or anxiety. As you plan, consider how other emergency plans may affect your family members at school, work, or care centers for children or elderly family members. - Establish several meeting locations to reunite with separated family members during an emergency
- Create a list of important contacts and telephone numbers to help communicate during an emergency
- Create a family communications plan that includes both local and out-of-state contacts
- Make a copy of your communications plan for each family member's 72-hour kit. Display important contact information in a visible area in your home
- Talk with young children about their responsibilities during an emergency situation. Teach them how to properly call for help when calling 9-1-1
- Plan to make email, texting, and social media your preferred way to communicate in an emergency. Save voice services for emergency responders.
